

Senioritis Strikes Again! Do You Remember When . . .

A REPORTER REMINISCES WITH THE HATCHET 'WAY BACK' MACHINE

There I sat with cob webs dangling from my nose, dust on my hands and a stack of old Hatchets before me. I climbed the rickety ladder to the very top of the heap. Some of the things I discovered from all those newspapers were amazing!

Washington was an elementary-junior high school for quite a while, at the very front of our way-back machine. Leafing excitedly through the relics I read such quotes as: "Luba Melovich, the JBT. news reporter left school December 16, because she was sixteen years old." An editorial in a '32 issue was printed for the elementary Washington. I wonder how this would sound in our paper today. "Now little people, if you would like to follow the steps of the juniors in Washington School, you must obey the patrol boy." In 1930, the ninth grade graduates printed statistics of their class. Thirty Hungarian, nineteen Polish, seven Americans, seven Belgian and six Germans, etc. were among the pupils leaving Washington. An editorial from that class of '30 asked the vital question every junior high graduate must ask himself. High school or work? Of course all of us can't go on, but everyone that is going on, can make his dreams come true. How many today think that a high school education can "make your dream come true"?

Extra! Extra!

Sneezingly, I shuffled through such profound headlines as: "The 6th grade is practicing for a flag drill for Washington's birthday." "Camp fire girls have Eskimo Pie Sale," "The Faculty is warmed Up," "Men Wanted," 1964 "Plate lunch Introduced," December 14, 1945 - "Senior Prom this Week," "Enrollment Increased by 21."

The students haven't changed much, even in '46 the complaints sounded like '65. The male inhabitants of Washington decided what was wrong with girls. They gossip too much, are too stuck up, complain too much about boys, go after older men, think too much of themselves. "The

girls think if they wear tight sweaters and bobby socks they can attract men." Other observers decided, that more gossip was needed in the Hatchet, that teachers gave too much homework, cafeteria needs more room and one bold griper asked, "Why do teachers have to be first in the lunch line?"

We still possessed that great spirit of winning. "The volleyball team wins two straight games from Nuner. You're going good girls."

A 'Can You Feature' article commented on some of our familiar staff in the 1940s. Can you feature . . . Mr. Redding forgetting to signal? Mr. Pilarski out for an evening without his little ones trailing behind? Miss Murphy without worries about Memory Lane or the Hatchet? Mr. Robinson with a toupe? (We find he — recited poetry back then, too)

Panthers were in Style

Returning to my paper throne with a can of insect killer, (some of the papers were a little buggy), I became interested in the fashion columns. One of our beloved staffers was featured in one such article. "Perhaps I need not mention this, but Mr. Holley should receive some sort of medal for the suits he manages to find to go with his ties. Honestly, some people can do the impossible." A while later he again made the news. "A notice for the history books — On the memorable day of Monday, March 4, 1946, Mr. Holley wore a plain white shirt and a tie that didn't blind you (if you looked at it through sun glasses)" Also in '46 the "In" fashions consisted of short sleeve sweaters either tucked in or worn out, cap sleeves were "strictly new," cashmere and angora "are really hubba hubba," "over-shoulder" purses, padded shoulder blouses — "keep those pads in, you're supposed to look like a football hero this year." In '51 purple corduroy, bobby sox, neck scarves and corduroy pants for boys were the big thing in clothes.

In the '41 prophesy it stated, "Ernest and Joe Hecklin-

ski are at the peak of their fame in Hollywood." (war is over.) I don't think your dads quite made it, how about it Tom and Mike?

When Mr. Jerry Klaybor was a student in '49, he seemed to be suffering from a loneliness complex. In February when the mid term seniors graduated he missed the boys in his homeroom. Before his graduation in June he hated to leave because he would miss Mr. Redding.

A New Washington

In 1960 the now Washington High School was completed & the students were packing up to leave the old building. Some of the things, I found, the Panthers were looking forward to most were, roller skating in the ramps, "a locker all to myself," study halls with desks to write on, and the girls were looking forward to the boys. One boy decided that the greatest thing would be to life guard during the girl's swimming class. Miss Hunsburger looked forward to: "a light, pleasant reading room, ample storage space & a work room. Mr. Van Camp: "my new auto shop, more room & one room of my own." Mr. Roggeman: "I am anxious to see whether or not the students will carry the torch of traditional excellence in everything that has burned so gloriously at old W.H.S." And judging from our Hatchet's headlines and stories, I am certain Coach Roggeman had nothing to worry about.

Washington High School won the team rodeo trophy. Other members of the WHS squad were Henry France, Randy Mahnesmith, and Richard Hunt.

Twenty-seven drivers competed in the rodeo, which was sponsored by the Department of Public Recreation and the High School Recreation Board, a student advisory group.

Basketball Season in Retrospect

The 1964-65 basketball season proved to be the most successful in Panther round-ball history. With a 14-4 record, the WHS men went into the South Bend Sectional confident. After a sudden snow storm delayed the tournament, Washington's game with North Liberty was rescheduled to a Friday night. The Panthers rolled past North Liberty Shamrock's, 73-46. The next day in the first afternoon game after a cold first half of play, the team rallied to take fast Lakeville, 63-49.

The most exciting game of the whole tournament was to come that evening when the mighty Panthers found themselves pitted against Central, champion veteran. The squad tired from playing three games in the span of twenty-four hours, never let Central take the lead. At half time the score was a shaky 34-30.

The score was tied three times in the third quarter, but that was as close as Central could get. The fourth quarter will never be forgotten by those who were present. The score was made 63-60 by a free throw by Tom Nowicki and with 0:42 remaining Wade Fuller hit for Central raising the score 63-62. Central was within one basket of spoiling Washington's first sectional title in twenty eight years. Emerson Carr with 13 seconds left tried to save his team. He shot into the air with just one second left missing, thereby cinching the championship for WHS.

The next week we moved on to Elkhart taking our first sectional victory beating Penn, and opening the way to the semi-state. In Fort Wayne we defeated Triton but lost by a mighty close margin in the evening game with Fort Wayne North.

Panther Tankers Post 10-5 Record

Coached by Mr. John Primer, in his first year at W.H. S., the Panther Tankers finished the 1964-5 swim season with a fine won-loss record of ten wins and five losses. During the year, team members smashed every existing individual and team record! Four of the team's five losses were real hair-raisers, which were undecided up to the very last event.

The greatest victories of the year — and of the school's history — were scored when the Tankers defeated Central in dual meet competition and took second in the Sectional Swimming Meet over both Riley and Central high schools as well as six other teams.

Senior members of the basically young team numbered only four: James Fisher, co-captain, a diver and member of the record-holding 200yd. freestyle relay team and Washington's only state medal winner for 1965; Mike Miko, record-holder in dual meet diving; Ken Parsons, a breast stroker and holder of the individual medley record; and Creighton Miller, a co-captain, record-holder in the 100yd. freestyle and member of the record-holding 200yd. freestyle relay team.

Washington's Pigskin Progress

The 1964 football season ended in a blaze of glory for the Washington Panthers. After tromping Goshen 41-7 Washington was placed in a three way tie with Elkhart and Riley for the Northeastern Indiana Conference Championship. Because Elkhart had previously participated in ten games during the season, they were disqualified from further competition. To the Panther's dismay, November presented Riley with the winning ballot in the draw between Washington and Riley for the right to play in the championship game.

After defeating East Chicago Roosevelt 35-20 in a runner-up playoff game, the Panthers closed another successful year with a record standing at 8 wins, 0 losses, and 2 ties. A truly great season came to a victorious close.
